RIVERSIDE AREA: STREET 240 – BOUTIQUE SHOPS, CAFES AND SPAS



BLISS

This boutique shop specializes in unique designs for men, women and children as well as the home. They sell silks, quilts, cushions, bags, bed covers, jewelry, and clothing. There is also a beautiful spa that offers massage, skin treatments, and a steam bath, sauna, and plunge pool.

REYUM ART AND CULTURE GALLERY

Reyum was founded in 1998 to provide a forum for research, preservation, and promotion of traditional and contemporary Cambodian arts and culture. This shop sells beautiful locally produced items, kitchen ware and art.

MARKETS



RUSSIAN MARKET (PHSAR TOM POUNG)

The name comes from after the Vietnamese occupation when it was a market for foreigners, and most foreigners were Russian. This place sells everything from souvenirs, antiques, carvings, handicrafts, silks, and other fabrics. In recent years the Russian Market area has boomed and there are now lots of smaller boutique shops, cafes and bars in the surrounding side streets which are worth an explore if you have time.

CENTRAL MARKET

Impressive art deco building in the heart of Phnom Penh built in 1937. The items sold here are similar to the Russian Market but it is worth visiting to view the architecture and how it remains a functioning market all these years later for many locals.

AEON MALL

The first large scale mall in Phnom Penh was developed by the Japanese group Aeon. A large well planned out, air conditioned mall with international brands, large supermarket and department store. There are also many restaurants and coffee shops including Starbucks, along with a cinema, bowling alley and ice ring. You can find most things that you might need here in a comfortable environment.
